Job Description: Youth Programme Manager

Role: Working closely with both internal and external partners in Swale and Medway the Youth Programme Manager will develop creative learning events and programming for young people at our base at No34 in Sittingbourne and outside our space in schools, colleges and other venues across the area.

You will be responsible for other Ideas Test learning activities, including topical events such as Science Week and locally-based initiatives with schools nearby, helping developing creative learning networks in the region, and attending existing networks

Responsibilities:

- Developing programme content for children and young people
- Ensuring that Creative Job Club and other funded activity for young people meets internal and external programme targets, and programme aims
- Maintaining and developing strong partnerships with our Arts Council, Bridge organisation, local authority education and Creative Job Club stakeholders to ensure continued high levels of engagement
- Playing an active role in Ideas Test work in Swale and Medway with opportunities to contribute to other areas of activity.
- Delivery of Arts Award and management of Ideas Test as an Arts Award centre.
- Writing and contributing to fundraising for youth programme activity.
- Data gathering and record keeping to track the impact of the programme.
- Other tasks and event support as required by the organisation.

Person specification:

- Experience of working with young people in a professional role
- Experience of delivering projects to a high standard, including working in partnership with external stakeholders
- An understanding of issues and opportunities related to the Creative People and Places Programme, the Arts Council England programme that is the principal funder of Ideas Test
- Qualified Arts Award Advisor or willingness to train as such.
- Excellent communication, interpersonal and presentation skills
- Understanding of diversity and inclusion and ability to engage and work successfully with young people in our local communities
- The ability to manage a complex and varied workload
- Experience of reporting, evaluation and impact measurement.



Location: Your main place of work will be the Ideas Test office at 34 High Street, Sittingbourne, with some travel to events/meetings at other locations.

Management: you will report to the Director and will be accountable through her to the Ideas Test Consortium.

Contract period: This role is a 12 month fixed term contract in the first instance. The role will be subject to a 3 month probation period. The contract will start on appointment

Salary: Starting salary £22-25,000 depending on experience.

Holidays: 25 days holiday per year pro rata plus bank holidays.

Working Hours: This is a full time role, 37 hours per week excluding breaks, and due to the nature of this programme, some flexibility in terms of working hours is required. This will include regular evening and Saturday working (with equivalent time off in lieu).

Employer: The Youth Programme Manager will be employed by Swale CVS on behalf of Ideas Test.
